RE: Rabies – duty to report animal bite or contact; post-exposure prophylaxis

QUICK FACTS

- All incidents of potential rabies exposure must be reported to Public Health staff to investigate, provide education, and monitor local activity, as per the <u>Health Protection and Promotion Act</u>.
- In addition to cat and dog scratches/bites, please also report bat, raccoon, skunk and other mammal contact, since there are ongoing cases of these animals testing positive for rabies in Burlington, Milton and Oakville.

HOW TO REPORT

Call 311 AND fax a completed Rabies Exposure Reporting Form to 905-825-8797 – 24/7, 365 days a year.

POST-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS (PEP)

- The <u>Rabies Prevention and Control Protocol</u> recommends that individuals receive post-exposure prophylaxis as soon as possible after the decision is made that PEP is required.
- Rabies immunoglobulin (Rablg) and vaccine for PEP are available upon request and will be delivered after completion of a risk assessment through Halton Region Public Health - 24/7, 365 days a year by calling 311 and requesting to speak to a Public Health Inspector.
- Please refer to the <u>Rabies Vaccine</u>, <u>Canadian Immunization Guide</u> for guidance on dose, route of administration and schedule of rabies PEP.
- Because of possible interference of Rablg with the immune response to the rabies vaccine, the dose of Rablg should not be exceeded.
- Rabies vaccine must never be given into the gluteal muscle due to the risk of a decreased immune response.
