RE: COVID-19 Vaccine Update 104: Updated Ontario Ministry of Health COVID-19 Vaccine
Guidance, RAT distribution, and Vaccine Ordering

QUICK FACTS

- The <u>Ontario Ministry of Health</u> recently updated its COVID-19 vaccine guidance to reflect recent guidance from <u>NACI</u> on the use of the bivalent mRNA products. Highlights include:
 - Using bivalent mRNA vaccines for primary series initiation or completion in individuals 6 months of age and older.
 - Individuals 5 years of age and older due for a COVID-19 booster, should consider delaying until Fall 2023 to maximize protection when peak circulation is expected.
 - Expanding indication of bivalent Moderna BA.4/5 to include individuals 6-17 years for use as a booster.
- NACI also recently released guidance on the use of <u>COVID-19 vaccines in Fall 2023</u>. Further information on the plan for Ontario from the Ministry of Health is expected shortly.
- There is currently a province-wide supply gap for the Novavax COVID-19 vaccine. We are awaiting more information from the federal government on the supply and distribution of the Novavax vaccines.
- Janssen has submitted a voluntary recall of its COVID-19 vaccine to Health Canada. This is not the result of any health or safety concerns with the product; rather it is in response to business decisions made by the manufacturer.
- Halton Region Community Immunization Clinics currently offer mRNA COVID-19 vaccine for children 6 mos to under 12 years of age.
- People 12 years and older can receive the COVID-19 vaccine at <u>participating pharmacies and</u> <u>primary care offices.</u>
- Protect your eligible staff and patients by providing an easy option for COVID-19 vaccination. Visit the <u>onboarding webpage</u> or email <u>pharmacists@halton.ca</u> with any questions.
- COVID-19 Rapid antigen test are available for order through Halton Region Public Health.

KEY MESSAGES FOR HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS

- The decision to receive a booster dose prior to Fall 2023 may be appropriate for certain individuals based on their unique health status and personal situation.
- Health care providers can order COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Tests for distribution to patients. Tests can be ordered by calling 311 or emailing <u>Access.Halton@halton.ca</u>. Please indicate the number







of boxes you would like to order. Each box contains fives tests. Rapid antigen tests will be distributed with your next vaccine order, upon request.

- When placing vaccine orders, health care providers can now choose to either:
 - Have vaccines couriered to their facility at their expense, or
 - Pick-up vaccines at the Halton Regional Centre at 1151 Bronte Road in Oakville on Tuesdays (9:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m.) and Wednesdays (9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.)
- Orders will continue to be distributed every other week according to the <u>Vaccine Distribution</u> <u>Schedule</u>. All vaccine orders must be submitted by the Wednesday prior to your scheduled delivery or pick-up date.
