Old Age Security (OAS)

Monthly pension to legal residents of Canada 65 years and older. Full pension paid to those who have lived in Canada for at least 40 years after turning 18 years of age. Partial pensions may be available.

Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS)

Monthly non-taxable benefit to low-income (OAS) recipients living in Canada.

Allowance

This is a monthly benefit for low income older adults (60 to 64 years old) whose spouse or common-law partner is currently receiving or eligible for OAS and GIS.

Allowance for Survivor

This is a monthly benefit to low income widows or widowers (60 to 64 years old).

Canada Pension Plan (CPP)

Retirement Pension

This is a monthly taxable benefit for retired contributors who are 65 years old or if an individual is between 60 and 65 years old and meets certain requirements.

Older Adult Property Tax Deferral Program

The Older Adult Property Tax Deferral Program supports older adults who need financial help to live in their own homes longer. The program, developed by Halton Region in partnership with the local municipalities, enables older adults (65 years old and older) with a total income below the Assisted Income Threshold to defer their annual property tax payments. The Assisted Income Threshold is assessed annually and as of January 2018, the income threshold is \$48,500.




