RE: COVID-19 Vaccine Update 103: COVID-19 booster recommended for high-risk individuals this spring

QUICK FACTS

Recommended Populations

- The Ministry of Health has released its latest <u>guidance</u> regarding COVID-19 vaccines. Consistent
 with NACI's most recent <u>recommendations</u> and to further protect against COVID-19, the following
 high-risk groups are recommended to receive a spring COVID-19 booster if it has been at least six
 months since their last dose or confirmed COVID-19 infection:
 - Individuals aged 65 years and older;
 - Residents of long-term care homes, retirement homes, Elder Care Lodges, and other congregate living settings for seniors;
 - Individuals aged 18 years and older living in a congregate care setting for people with complex medical care needs;
 - Pregnant individuals;
 - Individuals aged 18 years and older who are <u>moderately to severely</u> <u>immunocompromised</u>; and
 - Individuals aged 55 years and older who identify as First Nations, Inuit, or Métis and their non-Indigenous household members aged 55 years and older.
- Booster doses are no longer recommended at intervals less than six months since the last COVID-19 vaccine dose or a confirmed COVID-19 infection.
- For those outside of the high risk groups (listed above):
 - Individuals aged five and older who have completed a primary series who have not yet received a booster dose on or after September 1, 2022 remain recommended to receive a booster dose if it has been at least six months since their last dose or confirmed COVID-19 infection.
 - There is currently no evidence that substantiates the need for an additional dose at this time if a booster was already received on or after September 1, 2022.
 - Recommendations for future COVID-19 vaccine doses will be available closer to fall 2023.

• Protect your eligible staff and patients by providing an easy option for COVID-19 vaccination.
