RE: Public Health Ontario Updates to Hepatitis C Virus and Hepatitis B Virus Testing

QUICK FACTS

- Public Health Ontario (PHO) has implemented changes to Hepatitis C Virus (HCV) and Hepatitis B Virus (HBV) testing which include enhancing the HCV RNA viral load reflex testing and updating the <u>HCV/HBV Viral Load, Genotyping, and Drug Resistance Testing Requisition</u>
- These updates reduce the need to recall patients for follow-up blood collection and simplify test ordering using an updated requisition.
- Please use the updated requisition <u>form</u>. Submissions received using the old HCV/HBV Viral Load Requisiton form to PHO past **January 31, 2024 may result in testing delays or cancellations.**

KEY MESSAGES FOR HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS

- Previously, HCV RNA reflex testing was only performed for individuals with a first-time reactive HCV antibody test. The enhancement has now expanded reflex testing to include individuals who have:
 - o A previously reactive HCV antibody but no HCV RNA testing on record
 - A first-time inconclusive HCV antibody test
- The updated <u>HCV/HBV Viral Load, Genotyping, and Drug Resistance Testing Requisition</u> has been re-designed to simplify ordering HCV RNA/HBV DNA viral load testing and other related tests.
