RE: Paxlovid (Anti-viral Treatment for COVID-19)

## **QUICK FACTS**

- Paxlovid (anti-viral treatment for COVID-19) continues to be available to eligible residents in Halton Region free of charge.
- Paxlovid can be accessed by residents through their physician, nurse practitioner or a participating pharmacist.
- Eligibility criteria has expanded to now include anyone over the age of 18 who is unvaccinated and those who are 60 years of age and older.

### **KEY MESSAGES FOR HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS**

- Paxlovid and Tamiflu can be given at the same time where warranted. The decision to initiate this treatment is at the discretion of the treating physician.
- Individuals who are eligible for Paxlovid are those with a positive COVID-19 PCR, rapid molecular or rapid antigen test, including rapid tests done at home and are:
  - o 60 years of age or older; OR
  - o 18 years of age or older and immunocompromised; OR
  - 18-59 years old and at a higher risk of severe COVID-19 outcomes including having chronic medical conditions (ie. diabetes, heart disease); OR
  - o 18 years of age or older and have inadequate immunity to COVID-19 (ie. not up to date on vaccines)

### **KEY MESSAGES FOR PATIENTS**

- Paxlovid is an anti-viral treatment for COVID-19 that when initiated within 5 days of symptom onset, can reduce severe outcomes of COVID-19.
- COVID-19 testing locations and clinical assessment centres are listed at <u>COVID-19 testing locations</u> (ontario.ca)
- Staying up to date with COVID-19 vaccinations remains the best defense against COVID-19 and its variants. Visit <a href="Halton Region's website">Halton Region's website</a> for COVID-19 vaccination information, booking and locations.
