The Green Cart program is now available in your building!

Halton staff worked with your building's board of directors and/or property management team to develop a Green Cart program that will make sorting your waste convenient and easy for you.

The Kitchen Catcher and Green Cart are used to collect food waste and compostable papers.

Materials are diverted from landfill and turned into compost. The finished compost is used in agricultural and landscape projects in Halton.

Instructions

- Empty your kitchen catcher frequently into the building's Green Cart.
- Ensure the kitchen catcher lid is closed properly during storage and transportation to the Green Cart.
- Keep your kitchen catcher clean. Rinse regularly with hot water and soap, or place it in the dishwasher.

Green Cart Acceptable items



Fruit including cores & pits

Pizza boxes, paper cups, paper plates, paper egg cartons, paper towels, napkins, facial tissues, popsicle sticks, wooden toothpicks & wooden cutlery

Helpful tips

- Wrap food waste in newspaper or soiled paper towels to absorb moisture.
- Sprinkle a handful of salt, baking soda or powdered ginger in the Kitchen Catcher to avoid insects.

Kitchen catcher liners

You can line your Kitchen Catcher with certified compostable bags with the Biodegradable Products Institute (BPI) logo, as seen below:



Liners must carry the BPI logo.

Other acceptable liners include:

- Paper towels
- Newspaper/ flyers
- Paper bags

Did you know?

Food waste and compostable papers get collected in the green cart, helping to divert waste and extend the life of the landfill. It is then composted into natural fertilizer farmers use on their fields to grow more food for us.

Food waste is sent to an indoor facility where it also creates renewable energy!





Use your reusable blue bag to collect and store acceptable recycling materials. You can use your blue bag to carry recyclable materials to the Blue Cart.



Instructions

- You can mix papers, containers and bundled plastics in the same Blue Cart.
- Clean, dry and empty all recyclable plastics.
- Bundle all plastic bags and overwrap in one plastic bag and tie shut.
- Papers can be bundled and tied or placed loose.
- Flatten cardboard and boxboard.
- Tie cardboard in bundles no larger than 120 cm x 120 cm x 30 cm (4 ft x 4 ft x 1 ft).

Did you know?

Materials are diverted from landfill and recycled into new items you can use or wear.

Plastic containers, for example, are converted into polar fleece, carpet, tote bags, flooring, compost bins, garbage cans, paint trays and more.

Waste and Recycling Depot

In addition to regular waste disposal, the following materials can be diverted from landfill:

- Bikes

 - Eye glasses

- Natural cork
- Scrap metal
- Tires

Household Hazardous Waste Depot

Household hazardous waste can damage the environment if disposed of improperly. Do not place in garbage or pour down drains.

Residential hazardous waste is usually labelled as:



Halton residents can drop off household hazardous waste, free of charge. Please bring any hazardous materials in a securely closed container labeled with information about the contents. Maximum of 20 litres per visit. For more information on hazardous waste disposal visit **halton.ca/waste**



Electronic Waste

Electronics can be dropped off at HWMS, free of charge. You can also visit **recyclemyelectronics.ca** to find alternative drop off locations near you.



Battery Recycling Depot

Drop off batteries and cell phones for recycling at the Household Hazardous Waste Depot. You can also visit **rpra.ca** to find alternative drop-off locations near you.



Paint and Stain Reuse Depot

Painting your apartment? Pick up and drop off usable paint and stain, free of charge, from spring to fall.



Medications and sharps

Drop off unused or expired medications and sharps at a location near you. Visit **healthsteward.ca** to learn more.



Reuse Depot

Drop off unwanted household items in good condition, free of charge, and help support local charities and programs.
