RE: Flu & COVID-19 vaccine updates: delivery within two weeks, eligibility, high risk groups & more

QUICK FACTS

- The influenza vaccine and Moderna Spikevax® XBB COVID-19 vaccine are ready for delivery.
- COVID-19 vaccines will accompany influenza auto-shipments to support co-administration.
 Primary care offices that would like to receive COVID-19 vaccines with their auto-shipment must order COVID-19 vaccines using the <u>online vaccine order form</u>.
- The first auto-shipment will be delivered to your facility by Critical Path courier, starting on **Tuesday October 3**, at no cost to your facility. Refer to the auto-shipment delivery schedule below.
- The following populations are eligible for both <u>influenza</u> and <u>COVID-19</u> vaccination as soon as vaccines become available:
 - Hospitalized individuals and hospital staff
 - Long-term care home residents, staff and caregivers
 - o Residents and staff of retirement homes and other congregate living settings
 - Individuals at high risk for complications or hospitalization due to influenza or COVID-19 infection
 - o Health care workers and first responders
- Halton Region Community Immunization Clinics will begin offering XBB product on October 2. Appointments are available for eligible persons 6 months of age and older and can be booked at <u>halton.ca/COVIDvaccines</u>. XBB vaccine has also been provided to long-term care home and retirement home partners for administration on-site. At this time, due to limited supply XBB product is not available through pharmacies.
- Vaccination for the general population is anticipated to start **October 30**. Do not plan large-scale vaccination clinics before this date.
- Join Halton Region Public Health on October 4 at 8-9 p.m. for a <u>virtual Primary Care Town Hall</u> to learn about the outlook for the 2023-24 respiratory virus season, therapeutics and an immunization update for influenza and COVID-19. (Following the ISPA immunization Mainpro+ accredited CME at 7-8 p.m.). <u>Register for one or both sessions online.</u>

• The following influenza vaccine products will be available this influenza season:

- Fluzone® High-Dose Quadrivalent will be prioritized to hospitalized individuals and residents of long term care homes and retirement homes. Remaining doses will be made available for administration to other seniors in the community.
- Primary care providers can anticipate receiving <u>fewer influenza doses</u> in their auto-shipment(s) than what was received in 2022 because the Ministry of Health only receives a portion of the total provincial supply in October. Additional influenza vaccines can be ordered through the <u>online</u> <u>vaccine order form</u> starting **October 16.**

COVID-19 VACCINE KEY INFORMATION

- <u>NACI</u> and the <u>Ministry of Health</u> recommend using **XBB COVID-19 vaccines** this fall. Bivalent vaccines, while not recommended, are still available for ordering.
- Moderna Spikevax® is currently the only XBB COVID-19 vaccine product that is authorized by Health Canada. Pfizer and Novavax XBB products are currently awaiting Health Canada authorization. These products should be available later this fall. Individuals should not delay vaccination to wait for a particular vaccine product.

INFLUENZA & COVID-19 VACCINE DELIVERY INFORMATION

• The auto-shipment delivery schedule for the fall vaccination campaign is as follows:

*Oakville orders that have not been received on October 5 will be delivered on October 6 and orders that have not been received on October 13 will be delivered on October 16.

Auto-shipment #2 delivery dates are dependent on when Halton Region receives a second influenza vaccine delivery from the Ministry of Health.

- Facilities must have a staff member present on site to receive their vaccine delivery between the hours of 9 a.m. 4 p.m. Requests for a specific delivery time cannot be accommodated. Any vaccines not received by the facility, will be returned to Halton Regional Centre (HRC) and another delivery will be attempted the following week.
- Public hospitals, long-term care homes and retirement homes will be receiving **all** of their initial influenza vaccine from the **first auto-shipment**.

- Facilities that have asked to receive COVID-19 vaccines with their influenza auto-shipment, will receive requested doses with their first auto-shipment. Facilities will be receiving the Moderna Spikevax® XBB product.
- If additional doses are required, vaccines must be ordered using the <u>online vaccine order</u> <u>form</u>. Orders placed by **October 5, 2023** will be sent with your second auto-shipment.
 Orders placed after this date will be sent as per the <u>Vaccine Distribution Schedule</u>.
- Primary care providers will be receiving their initial influenza vaccines in two auto-shipments.
 - Primary care offices that would like to receive COVID-19 vaccines with their auto-shipment must order COVID-19 vaccines using the <u>online vaccine order form</u>. Orders placed by October 5, 2023 will be sent with your second auto-shipment. Orders placed after this date will be sent as per the <u>Vaccine Distribution Schedule</u>.
